Message from District Governor Ivanhoe Love, Jr.


Greetings Rotarians

PETS Featured Speakers



A project called A Mural Movement began in 2020 when (Brett) Hubka, then president of the Rotary Club of Clay Center, suggested hiring an artist to paint something eye-catching on the wall of a downtown building. The first work, a colorful greeting in the style of a postcard, went up across the street from City Hall. Last summer, the Wardcraft Homes Store got mural No. 25, Sunflower State of Mind. "It's been great for the town's morale and for business," Hubka says.

RI President-elect Announces 2023-24 Theme



Rotary International President-elect R. Gordon R. McInally called for members to capture the world's attention and lead the way toward possibilities far beyond our current expectations.

McInally, a member of the Rotary Club of South Queensferry, West Lothian, Scotland, revealed the 2023-24 presidential theme, *Create Hope in the World*, during the Rotary International Assembly in Orlando, Flori-

da on 9 January. He urged members to promote peace in troubled nations, help those affected by conflict, and maintain the momentum of initiatives begun by past leaders.

"The goal is to restore hope — to help the world heal from destructive conflicts and, in turn, to help us achieve lasting change for ourselves," McInally said at Rotary's annual training event for incoming district governors.

Turkey and Syria were struck by a devastating earthquake on 6 February that has killed tens of thousands of people, destroyed thousands of homes and other structures, and left people across the region without shelter in bitterly cold winter weather. communicated with the affected districts, and encouraged governors in those regions to apply for disaster response grants. In addition, our project partner ShelterBox and service partner Habitat for Humanity are working on their responses.

Is Your Club Logo & Branding Current? A message from RI President Jennifer Jones







Dear Rotarians,

Nearly a decade ago, while I was the chair of the Strengthen Rotary's Brand Committee, we conducted indepth research to better understand how the public viewed Rotary, our members, and our work. What we learned was that we needed to reposition the Rotary brand by focusing on clear, consistent messages and a unified visual identity.

Based on the committee's recommendation, the Board of Directors approved new brand guidelines, which included how clubs should use the Rotary logo. Simply put, club logos should include the club name either above or below the Rotary logo, like those shown above.

A brand is more than just a logo, but a logo is a big part of our visual identity. When the public sees it throughout their community, they begin to think of Rotary members as people of action. Using the same visual elements unites Rotary, Rotaract, and Interact and allows us, as a diverse glob-

al organization, to tell our story with one voice.

The RI Board of Directors is asking every club to update its logo to align with Rotary's brand guidelines.

We have many resources available, as well as those in the newly updated <u>Brand Center</u>, for assistance.

This year, my Imagine Impact tour will highlight how Rotary members are creating positive, lasting change while it also introduces Rotary to new audiences and potential partners. This is where I need your help. Think of how much more impact these stories will have when they're shared with one global voice!

Let's continue to help our clubs attract the next generation of people of action as we increase our im-

pact around the world.


